He married a Polish wife and made a testament to give his inheritance to all his Polish heirs, but only if Poland has become free again.

Mrs Ehrenbard knows about (12) other heirs in **Paris/France** and had asked a syndicate of advocates in London to find out more. Maybe a "Kurjera Czerwonego" ("Red Courier") is mentioned.

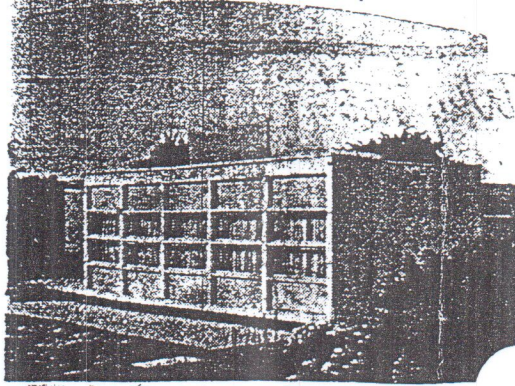

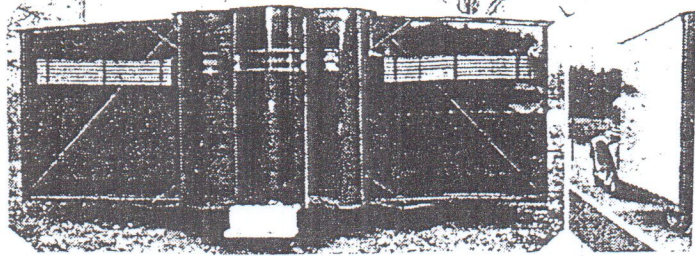

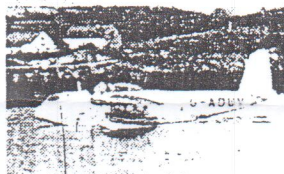

SCOTLAND'S Sabbath has been unchanged by modern ideas.

Last week a young Scots ship's steward obeyed an order of a tribunal of the Free Presbyterian Church of Scotland to place his kirk before his job, because his steamer left Stornoway for the mainland on a Sunday.

Rigid adherence to a moral code set up four centuries ago is strongest in the Highlands and Hebrides, but even in the cities of Scotland the Sabbath is solemnly observed.

In Glasgow on the Sabbath cinemas, theatres, public houses, and billiard saloons are closed, and only a few restaurants and small shops in the suburbs are open.

Scots who want a pint of bitter must cross the Border, and there is an alcoholic invasion of England every Sunday morning all along the boundary between the two countries.

Independent Wins Oxford

A MAN LEFT £1,000,000 IN 1802

THE Independent candidate won the Oxford University parliamentary election yesterday.

Figures were:—

Sir Arthur Salter (Ind.) 7,580
 Sir Farquhar Buzzard (Con.) .. 3,917
 Prof. Lindemann (Ind. Con.) .. 3,508
 Majority 3,663

The by-election was caused by the resignation of Lord Hugh Cecil on his appointment as Provost of Eton.

Figures at the General Election in 1926 (two seats) were:—
 Lord Hugh Cecil (Con.) .. 7,255
 Mr. A. P. Herbert (Ind.) .. 5,206
 Mr. C. R. M. F. Cruttwell (Con.) .. 4,697
 Mr. J. L. Stocks (Lab.) .. 2,776
 Con. maj. 3,668. Ind. maj. 1,509.

Two Independents—the other is Mr. A. P. Herbert, the humorist—now represent the university. It is the first time for many years that Oxford has not had a Conservative representative in the House of Commons.

VOTES TOO LATE

A big batch of letters, many containing votes, arrived five minutes after the poll closed at 5.30. The returning officer (the vice-chancellor) refused to accept the votes.

There was no declaration of the poll, as there was no one to whom to declare it.

When the result was made known Sir Arthur Salter said:—

"The result clearly indicates that the Oxford electorate considers the university vote should not be treated as a mere party one."

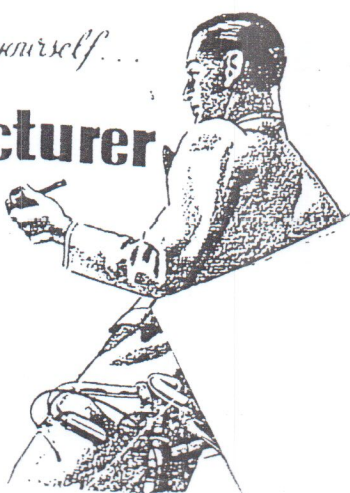

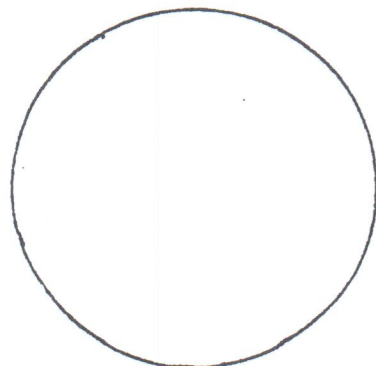

Rapport des recherches sur Mrs. SADIE EHRENBARD et famille.

Le nom EHRENBARD est extrêmement rare en Angleterre et notre correspondant a effectué les recherches de décès auprès de l'Office Général du Registre à Londres afin de retrouver et obtenir les certificats de décès de Mrs. Sadie Ehrenbard et de son mari.

Il en ressort que le mari de Mrs. Sadie Ehrenbard est décédé en premier.

Notre correspondant joint à son rapport :

1. Certificat de décès de ISRAEL EHRENBARD :

Décédé le 10 janvier 1976 au Wembley hospital dans la commune londonienne de Brent (précédemment dans le comté du Middlesex). Il est décrit comme un bijoutier en retraite. 18 Barn Hill, Wembley, Middlesex et était apparemment né en Russie le 6 juin 1888.

Son décès a été déclaré par son petit fils, Mr David Stewart SWEDE. 2 Seymour Close. Nugents Park, Hatch End, (près de Wembley), Middlesex.

Mrs. Sadie Ehrenbard est décédée il y a seulement 7 an et notre correspondant joint à son rapport :

2. Certificat de décès de SADIE EHRENBARD :

Décédée le 5 avril 1986 à Hadley Lawns, Kitto End Road, Hadley, Hertfordshire.

Ses avoirs s'élevaient à plus de 70.000 £, qui représentaient une grosse somme en 1976.

4. Testament de SADIE EHRENBARD

Ce document confirme l'adresse et la date du décès.

Sadie Ehrenbard a rédigé son testament le 6 juin 1977 et légua ses biens personnels et réels en parts égales à ses quatres petits enfants dénommés, Michel Norman Swede; David steward Swede; Janet Louise Cohen et Pamela Margaret Carne.

Les exécuteurs testamentaires étaient les dénommés David Stewart Swede et Bernard Carne qui était probablement le mari de Pamela Margaret Carne.

Le testament fut accordé aux deux exécuteurs le 3 février 1987 et les avoirs de Mrs. Ehrenbard s'élevaient à plus de 160.000 £.
